Progress continues through donations to Historical Society

On behalf of the Frederick Area Historical Society (FAHS) and museum, we would like to thank our friends who continue to support our mission through donating their time, artifacts, and funding. As we begin our eleventh year of service to the community, the fruits of your generosity are witnessed by the improvements that have been made to the Fylpaa building, which houses the museum's artifacts. The Senn School House, which is located on the property, is also in the process of being restored.

The Fylpaa's were one of Frederick's first businesses who established the Fylpaa Mercantile Company in 1902. It is one of the community's original buildings that remains on Main Street. We have been diligently working to preserve the building by making many upgrades. Last year we finished replacing the exterior siding and replaced various windows. We also poured a new concrete sidewalk to make access to the museum easier, including a ramp and hand railing for those who require additional assistance.

Another significant goal was to replace the original flooring on the first floor of the building. We completed the upgrade with new flooring while keeping the nostalgic "look" in place.

The west side of the building has signage which reads *The Fylpaa Mercantile Co*. This is displayed to replicate the original look of the building and to acknowledge John Fylpaa, who has generously donated funds to support our mission.

This year our focus is to install electrical service into the Senn School House. Electricity will provide the means to start interior renovation projects. We will also be making electrical upgrades in the Fylpaa Building to stay current ... get it?

Finally, when you donate money to FAHS, which is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation, your donation is what helps us do what we do. We value your support, and feel it is important that you are aware how your donations are being spent.

ABOUT KEVIN BARTON

All volunteer firefighters have SISU. For his extra efforts, Kevin Barton for his time and efforts is recognized as this year's SISU honoree. Kevin Barton started as a firefighter serving the Frederick area in the fall of 2001. In 2012 he became fire chief of the all-volunteer squad.

The number of volunteers has increased significantly since Kevin took over leadership. When asked if there was a key to getting people involved he said he found that if he shared knowledge, the volunteers became more involved and driven with the purpose. Those good volunteers brought in more good people. Barton said, 'Each one (volunteer) has specific talents that enhance our fire department. Very proud to know every single one of them. Some of them I may have never got to interact with if I didn't get know them down at the station."

In addition to the increased number and commitment of volunteer firefighters, other changes under Kevin's leadership include:

- In 2013 a used F350 4 door was purchased and one of our volunteers found a tank unit to install on it.
- We got a UTV side by side in 2014
- A public vote passed for the taxing for an official fire district in Jan 2016
- A new #1 engine bought with taxing district funds was delivered in December 2016.
- 2017 a used Ford F550 was purchased for wildland fires.
- A used UTV to help with wildland fires so we can get into places where bigger trucks can't go was purchased in 2018.
- We now have a truck in Barnard for fire fighters who live in that area
- We also have a truck at Elm lake with a crew of fighters in their area.

Kevin's commitment to the Frederick Fire Area Fire and Rescue isn't his only volunteer gig. He's also been an active member of

the Elm Valley Community Club since 1995. He has been a board member of the Ellendale Country Club for 9 years and put in numerous volunteer hours improving aspects of the course. Kevin also served as a board member and past President of the Brown County Fire Chiefs Association since 2007.

What Kevin loves most about his hometown is the small town atmosphere and understanding public. Some communities have tried and failed to pass a fire district and the Frederick Community supported the effort by quite a large margin. That kind of support makes it easier to want to stay committed to the volunteer effort.

When asked what inspires Kevin to continue on as a volunteer he answered, "Serving with good people who help and inspire me as a person in all the volunteer organizations, especially the men and women of both the fire & rescue services that we offer to the community of Frederick."

He added Our EMS squad is top notch. We're able to transport and provide basic life support for our community. The volunteer rescue squad is under the direction of Firefighter/EMT Director David Losure.

Finn Fest honors Frederick's Finnish heritage

rederick is named after a Finnish man, Kustaa "Frederick" Bergstadius, who was a clerk and emigrant agent for the Chicago-Milwaukee-St. Paul Railway Company. Some records say that he never actually visited the area, but he was satisfied enough with the report of a friend, Erick Pikkarainen, that he encouraged others to move there.


Finnish immigrants were among the area's first settlers; many of them homesteaded northeast of Frederick in the area of Savo, which was named after Bergstadius' home province in Finland.

The first Finn Fest was held in 2008 when members of Frederick Forward, a community development group discussed having an annual festival in the town. It started with the help of the Horizons program of the Northeast Area Foundation. It was decided that the festival should celebrate what makes Frederick unique and that is the town's Finnish heritage.



The caption on this publicity map reads: "Was founded in the spring of 1882 and is the finest town site in Dakota, and, during the first year of its existence, rapidly developed in size and prominence, now numbering about 700 population and many solid business enterprises. Among its many improvements it has every facility for commercial business in the way of railroads, telegraph, banking, express, mail, etc., is situated on the Maple River and on the H. & D. Division of the C., M. & St. P. R. R., and soon to be connect with the Northwestern by the O., F. & B. R. R. from Ordway to Bismarck, which is to be completed to Frederick at an early day. Frederick is in the center of the best agricultural part of the Jim River Valley, with pure water, fine churches and schools, excellent society, and destined to become a prosperous commercial city. For information as to prices of lots, etc., address C. F. Campau, Frederick, D. T."

Finnish games offer something for all ages

Hefting wives and tossing boots may not be Olympic sports, but that doesn't mean Finns don't take them seriously! (Well, OK, there sometimes might be a smile peeking around a competitor's game face.) These sports have large tournaments in Finland that attract international participants.

The wife-carrying competition, eukonkanto, which tests both a couple's physical condition and sense of humor, has its roots in the stories of a robber who would steal girls from neighboring villages. In the contest, men can carry their wives however they like, but they must take care not to drop them, or they will have seconds added to their time! The fastest wife-carrying couple receives the equivalent of the wife's weight in beer.

In the boot toss, or saappaanheitto, contestants try to throw their boots as far as they can. They can grip the boot however they like, but the leg of the boot must be straight while it is in the air. We'll have some "official" rubber boots on hand for the contest! Nearly all ages can participate.

And if you've ever had the urge to chuck your cell phone, join us for *kännykänheitto*.

You can also try the Finnishversion of "Dance Dance Revolution." It's *tikkuristi*, a dance done over two crossed sticks.



The music gets faster, and the goal is keeping the dancing going without touching the sticks. Last one still dancing wins!

Kubb and mölkky, both involving throwing pieces of wood, are great strategy games for all ages. This year, Frederick is an official site for the USA Mölkky Tour!
