Athletes bring home honors from state meet

Frederick Area saved its best finish for the last event at the state track meet: The boys 4x400-meter relay team became Class B state champions in the event with a 3:29.09 personal-record time that also broke a school record set in 2010.

The team, made up of Mason Hinz, Stephen Achen, Brayden Sumption, and Johnathan Bretsch, had been seeded first in the event with a time of 3:34.24. They cut two seconds in the preliminary race and three more in the finals the next day.

This was an impressive ending to a remarkable state meet overall. Frederick Area sent 16 athletes (10 boys and six girls) to compete in 14 events at the state meet, held May 26-28 in Sioux Falls. Five athletes made appearances on the awards podium: In addition to the relay team, Morgan Sumption placed in two events—sixth in the 800-meter run and seventh in the 1,600-meter run.

One other Frederick Area team also went home with medals: The boys 4x800-meter relay team, made up of Achen, Sumption, Bretsch, and Winston Clark, placed third in the first event of the meet on Thursday. (Only the top relay team gets to wave from the podium.)

Frederick Area continues to increase its representation at the state meet. Last year, 12 Frederick Area athletes (nine boys and three girls) participated.

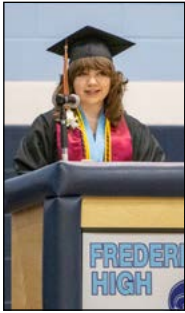

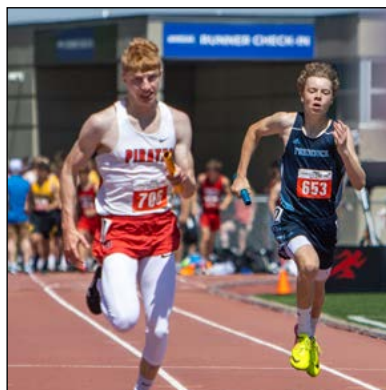

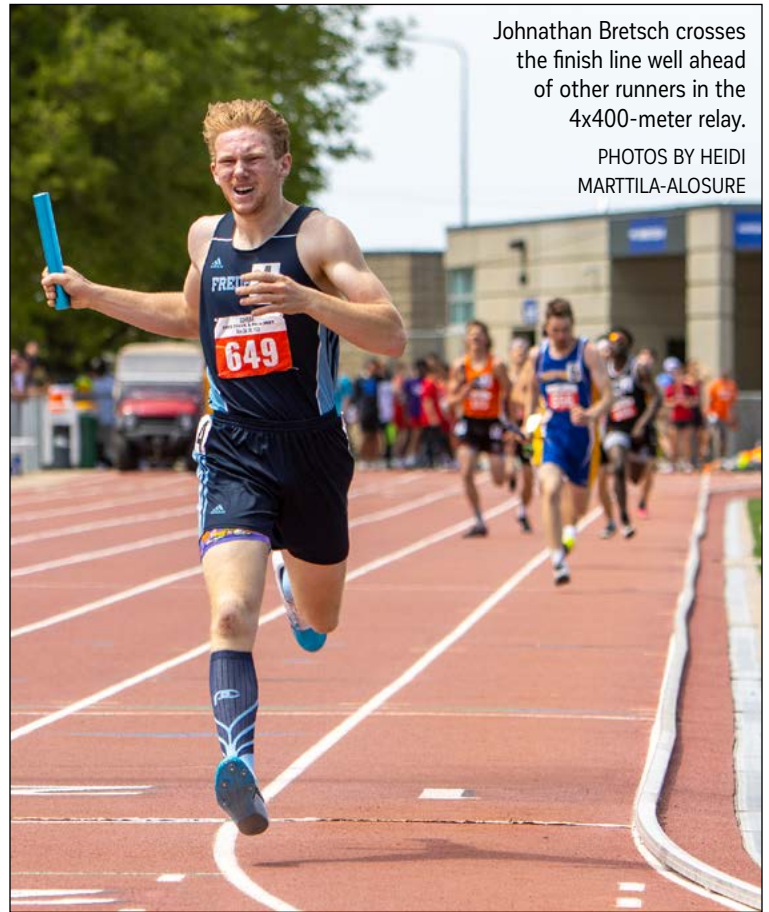

Jake Sumption (655) and Milo Sumption (656) compete in the 3,200-meter run.

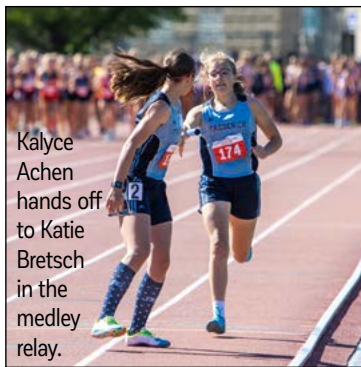


Johnathan Bretsch crosses the finish line well ahead of other runners in the 4x400-meter relay.

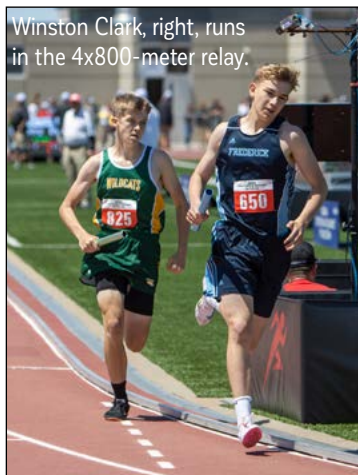


Kalyce Achen hands off to Katie Bretsch in the medley relay.

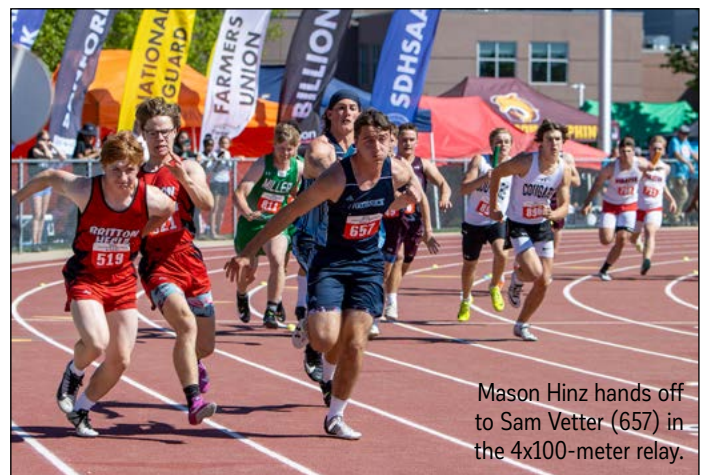

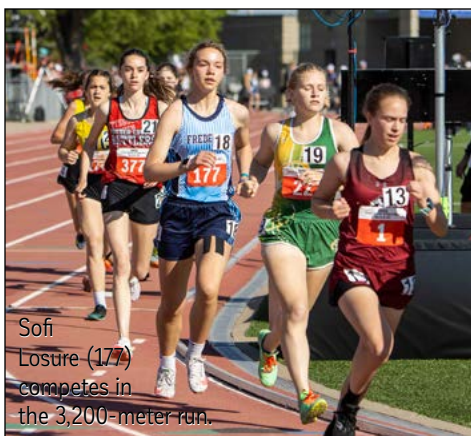

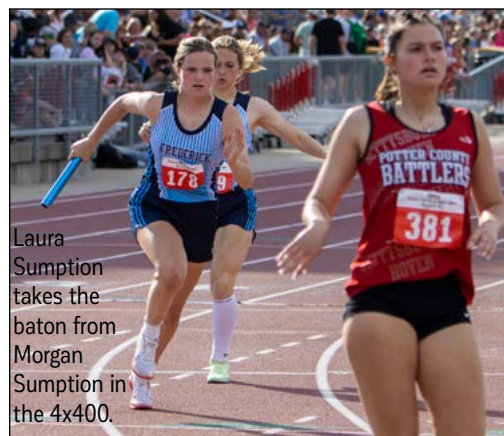
Winston Clark, right, runs in the 4x800-meter relay.
