




The Frederick Development Corporation is starting work on a new construction project this fall—a twin home, to be built at the corner of Third Avenue and Fifth Street.

Titans to play at new stadium in Aberdeen

The Leola-Frederick Titans will be among several area high school teams to play a football game this fall at Dacotah Bank Stadium, Northern State University's new facility in Aberdeen.

The Titans will face the Ipswich Tigers at 1 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 24, at the stadium as part of the Lake Region Conference Classic. Three other high school games will be played at the stadium that weekend.

This arrangement gives the high school teams a chance to play at an impressive new facility, and it gives NSU a chance to show what it has to offer to athletes that are considering their college options, according to NSU athletic director Nate Davis, who was quoted in a SD SportScene story on July 29.

Playing one game at Dacotah Bank Stadium meant giving up one home game for the Titans, and created some unusual dynamics for Homecoming at both schools.

The Titans will play in Frederick Aug. 19 and 26; the Aug. 26 game will be Frederick's Homecoming, which is the first week of school. Coronation will be at 2:45 Tuesday, Aug. 23, the first day of school.

Leola's Homecoming game will actually be the Sept. 24 game played in Aberdeen. The Titans will play in Leola on Oct. 14, which will be Senior Night.

Twin home: Housing intended for families

1,200-square-foot home would have two bedrooms and two bathrooms. Each home would also have a 576-square-foot garage. The FDC intends to sell each of the twin homes and the lots they sit on when the homes are completed. They will be advertised at a cost of \$280,000 for the three-bedroom home, and \$240,000 for the two-bedroom home.

The project is being financed with loans from the South Dakota Housing Development Authority and Homes Are Possible, Inc. of Aberdeen.

Construction will be done by Binger Building Company of Redfield. The plan is for ground work to begin in August, and framing to start in September. The project is expected to be completed in December.

A twin home—or two homes that share a fireproofed common wall on the property line—was chosen for the property because it would allow housing to be built for two families in that space.

The project is intended to serve families with children. A community gathering in 2017 found that area residents see keeping the school open

and thriving as a high priority. A lack of housing in the community has been an impediment to bringing new families into the school district.

Frederick Area Superintendent Jeff Kosters noted this in a letter in support increasing housing in the community: "I have had a couple of situations in which families were wanting to enroll their children here from Aberdeen, and they greatly wished to try and move to Frederick so the kids could be in town for school and activities and the parents would commute to work. In both of those instances, the families were not able to send their children here due to not having housing available."

The lot had previously been owned by Don Glover, who, after meeting with the corporation's board, agreed to sell it to the corporation for the

This is the third housing project that the corporation has worked on in the past four years. A four-bedroom, three-bath home was built in 2019, and Maple Valley Senior Apartments were completed in 2021.

Banners honoring mascots from the three schools that combined to become what is now Frederick Area School District have been on display in the school lunchroom this summer, including for a dedication ceremony held during the All-School Reunion on June 25. The banners will eventually find a spot in the gymnasium.

They were sponsored by a grant from the North Brown Community Foundation.

According to the South Dakota Department of Education, the Barnard school district closed in 1960, becoming part of the Frederick district. The Westport school district closed in 1967, when Frederick, Westport, and Hecla districts became the North Brown School District, which existed for nine years. In 1976,

the North Brown district was reorganized into Hecla-Houghton and Elm Valley. Elm Valley changed its name to Frederick Area in 2007.

These changes were part of a trend of consolidation that happened across South Dakota and other rural states. The highest number of school districts ever in South Dakota was in 1930, when there were 3,449. There were still more than 3,000 in 1950.

In 1968, South Dakota voters passed a referendum that decreed that all of the land in the state had to become part of an independent school district. By 1976, the number of public school districts in the state had decreased to about 200.

There are 149 public school districts in the state today.







Town of Frederick Storm Clean Up Community Meeting, June 16, 2022

A Special Storm Incident Community meeting following Day 3 of cleaning up from the devastating Derecho which swept through Frederick on Tuesday morning before sunrise, June 14th, 2022, was held in the Frederick Community Center Thursday afternoon, June 16. Chairman Scott Campbell opened the 4 oclock meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and thanked every-one for coming.

Forty-five community members attended with Campbell and Board Member Troy Millard, Utility Manager Rich Bakeberg, and Finance Officer Diane Bruns. All were Storm Clean Up team members.

Fire Chief Kevin Barton, Dan Nickelson and Scott Meints, the Brown County Emergency Management Director from Aberdeen, SD, also attended the special meeting.

Campbell explained the plans for getting the trees down and moved into the boulevard before next Wednesday, June 22, with the volunteers help of machinery and manpower, all branches and stumps in the boulevards will be hauled to the city landfill. There will be no rubble and no metal picked up.

Meints praised the early morning volunteers who arrived at the firehall not long after the power went out, (and was out 17 hours). Meints complimented the ability of Fredericks Incident Command Center and how smoothly all was run the last 3 days, the over-whelming volunteerism, and all the equipment that has been in Frederick. The Salvation Army provided a lunch and a hot supper to all the towns people because no one had electricity. He stressed the need to keep track of everything for the State FEMA office.

Chief Barton talked about coordinating trucks during Wednesdays cleanup around the landfill area. He thanked all the volunteers and mentioned how amazing they are. Told the people attending from the country to get in touch with the FFA office to get on their field debris list.

Chairman Campbell turned the meeting over to questions and comments.

First question was about a disruption between a private tree cutter, some volunteers and the deputy sheriff being called. The discussion was continued to after this meeting.

Millard continued the meeting with questions about clean-up. Another question was on landfill hours and it being closed. It has not been closed during this incident but will be next Wednesday during clean-up.

Private tree cutters do not need to come to the firehall to sign in. Millard pointed out the city will not come in and cut trees especially where there could be property damage and especially not cut trees laying on top of motorhomes or vehicles.

Chairman Campbell said they appreciate everyone's help. Contact Rich Bakeberg if you need help moving branches before Wednesday.

Scott Meints ended the meeting by asking for a round of applause for The Town of Frederick and a job well done.

Meeting ended at 4:45 PM.
