## Champs: Most Titan runners cut time despite tough conditions

After winning the Lake Region Conference title on Oct. 5, the Frederick Area girls team knew their biggest competition at regions would come from one team that wasn't in their conference: James Valley Christian. JVC's top two runners finished fourth and fifth, but their third runner came in 23rd, after both Bretsch and Ellwein. JVC finished second in the team competition with 29 points, behind Frederick Area's 26 points.

JVC wasn't the only strong competition in Region 1B, however. Six of the top eight Class B girls teams in athletic.net's rankings are in Region 1B: Frederick Area, James Valley Christian, Ipswich, Northwestern, Deubrook, and Aberdeen Christian.

Only the top three teams from any region can advance. The third Region 1B team to make it to state, in addition to Frederick Area and JVC, is Northwestern, which tied Ipswich with 35 points but won based on their fourth runner.

## Boys Varsity

The Frederick Area boys team came into the region meet with a pretty good idea who their toughest competition was, since they had lost to them at the conference meet just one week earlier. Northwestern's Lincoln Woodring led his team to a conference title on Oct. 5, and he finished first at regions as well. The rest of the places didn't shake out quite the same, however, and the Titans found a way to take the team title.

All five of the Titan runners qualified for the state meet individually by finishing in the top 20 .

Senior Stephen Achen, who has been battling shin splits, gutted it out for 18th place and a one-second improvement from September. Sophomore Noah Kippley improved his Sept. 12 time by 11 seconds to snag 20th place.

The Titans won with 14 points, followed by Northwestern with 19 points and Deubrook with 31.

## Junior Varsity

Many of the junior varsity runners started their combined race soaked to the skin after sleet turned into a brief but intense downpour. Perhaps that made the Titan runners eager to get to the finish, as they all ran well.

In the boys competition, eighthgrader Titus Kippley won the race, his second win of the year. Seventhgrader Howard Sumption was not far behind, finishing second. Erik Losure improved his time on that course by more than a minute and a half to finish 10th. Jax Holmes improved his time by about 50 seconds and came in 17th.

All of her teammates also received medals: Junior Chloe Arneson cut 50 seconds off her Sept. 12 time to finish fifth, Samantha Dallmann had a 30 -second improvement to finish 6th, and Arabella Clark cut about 30 seconds to finish 7th.

Tate Dosch, the lone sixth-grader in cross country, could not compete at regions but ran at a middle school competition on Tuesday and received a medal.

The Titans' 10 varsity runners now turn their attention to the state meet, which will be held Saturday, Oct. 22, at Broadland Creek National Golf Course in Huron. The Class B girls race starts at $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$., and the boys race is at 2:30 p.m.
